

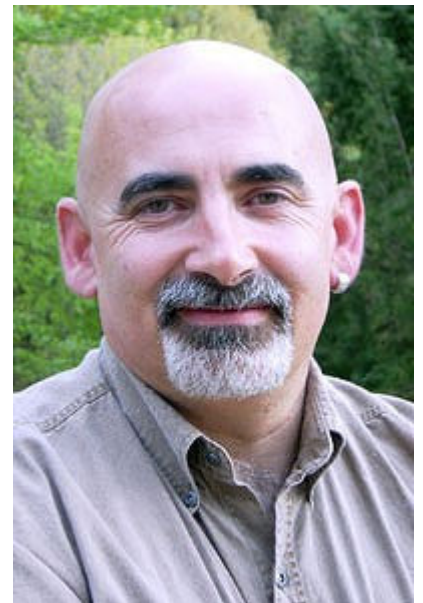


“The Future of Further Education”

Speaker: Dylan Wiliam

Dylan Wiliam is Emeritus Professor of Educational Assessment at Institute of Education, University of London where, from 2006 to 2010 was its Deputy Director. In a varied career, he taught for 7 years in urban public schools, was appointed a Nuffield Research Fellow at Chelsea College, directed a large-scale testing program and worked in a number of high profile roles in university education.



Previous positions have included Dean and Head of the School of Education at King's College London (1996-2001), Assistant Principal at Kings College London (2001-2003) and Senior Research Director at the Educational Testing Service (ETS) in Princeton, NJ (2003-2006).

Dylan's PhD is in Psychometrics and he has a prolific publication record: over 300 articles, book chapters, and books in mathematics education, education law, and educational assessment. He is internationally noted for his pioneering work in assessment for learning, and was the co-author, with Paul Black of a major review of the research evidence on formative assessment ('Inside the Black Box') published in 1998. Dylan's work continues to be critical of the 'grading and sorting' role that assessment currently plays in UK schools and colleges, and the harm this can inflict on learner self-efficacy, opportunity and achievement.
